- **Enabling Smarter Cities**

Everyone aspires to introduce smart cities. However, city communities continue to face fundamental questions such as: what really is a smart city, how do we get one, and will it actually help us? This session will focus on the two key themes we see as key to cities efficiently adopting and deploying digitalisation solutions to drive more sustainable cities.

1. How can cities establish the social systems that will ensure that data and smart city systems can be managed effectively as a 21<sup>st</sup> century commons?
2. What data interoperability standards are needed to unlock innovations from universal access to securely managed data?

- **Capital Platforms**

Transformative work in cities will create opportunities for, and will require, massive financial investments - touching hard and soft infrastructure, enterprises, buildings and distributed technology applications. Part of the transformation process entails defining the service models that are inclusive, adaptive, and tailored to specific local imperatives. Join this session that explores the essential role of effective capital platforms for financing these service models.

- **Evaluation Frameworks**

City communities need to capture their vision for change in locally-relevant indicators that are useful for measuring their progress. Join this session to help strengthen the approach we have consolidated for helping city communities co-develop a dedicated indicator framework of aims, targets and indicators suited for their strategy and projects.

- **Capacity Development for Cities**

This session is an invitation to partners to collaborate in the design and implementation of Climate-KIC's overarching capacity development programme for cities. We will present the capacity



development programme structure for cities that we have been developing in 2018, and through this session we aim to identify relevant partners, who would be interested in joining our community's efforts to grow and deliver this work.
