

### Vision and objectives for 2040



An attractive and predictable agri-food sector where incomes enable farmers to thrive, attracting future generations

# A new way of working: Building trust and dialogue

- Trust and dialogue across the entire value chain (EU and globally)
- Stronger engagement with farmers, food chain operators, institutions, and civil society
- Addressing concerns and ideas at local and regional levels
- Collective effort to define the future of EU farming and agri-food
- The diversity of situations calls for territorial approaches (rather than one-size-fits-all approaches)
- EBAF, Civil Dialogue Groups, CAP Network, Youth Policy Dialogue, Food Dialogue ...

#### An attractive sector

- Drawing on all sources of income:
  - OHelping farmers get a better return from the market by ensuring a fair functioning food chain
  - Offering fair and targeted public support
  - OLeveraging entrepreneurial potential and new sources of income
- Investing in the transition and rewarding ecosystem services
- Attracting future generations to the profession

#### Main actions

- Reviewing the Unfair Trading Practices Directive and Common Market
   Organisation Regulation
- Proposing a fairer, simpler and more targeted common agricultural policy (CAP)
- Presenting a Bioeconomy Strategy
- Promoting carbon farming and developing opportunities for nature credits
- Delivering a Generational Renewal Strategy
- Advancing an EU Observatory on Farmland
- Working with the EIB and banking sector to leverage private capital

## The CAP – General principles

"The public support through the CAP remains essential to support farmers' income"

- Simpler and more targeted
- From conditions to incentives, a clearer balance between regulatory and incentives-based policies
- Simplified conditionality
- Further streamlining CAP implementation
- Architecture:
  - basic policy objectives and targeted policy requirements
  - further responsibility and accountability for MS on how to meet objectives

## The CAP – Targeting

"Future CAP support will be more directed towards farmers that actively engage in **food production**, towards the **economic vitality of farms** and the **preservation of our environment**."

"The support should be further directed towards those **farmers who need it most**, with a particular attention to the farmers in areas with natural constraints, young and new farmers, and mixed farms."

- Simplified income support for small and medium-sized farms
- Enhanced use of degressivity and capping
- All farmers to benefit from payments for ecosystem services, investment support, crisis and risk management tools

#### A competitive and resilient sector

- Strengthening international partnerships
- Promoting fairer global competition
- Reducing critical dependencies
- Enhancing climate adaptation
- Improving risk and crisis management
- Simplifying and reducing administrative burden
- Strengthening the resilience of agricultural markets

#### Main actions


- Pursuing a stronger alignment of production standards (animal welfare and pesticides)
- Establishing a Unity Safety Net to address global challenges
- Developing a comprehensive protein plan
- Adopting a European Climate Adaptation Plan
- **✓** Simplification package on the CAP
- Cross-cutting simplification package for farmers and food businesses
- ✓ Launching a work stream on livestock
- ✓ Presenting a wine package

## A future-proof sector

- Supporting the EU's climate objectives through better incentives
- Making sure decarbonisation and competitiveness go hand in hand
- Integrating economic and implementation challenges in the ecological transition
- Preserving healthy soils, clean water and air
- Protecting and restoring the EU's biodiversity

#### Main actions

- Ensuring better implementation, streamlining and enforcement of existing legislation
- More advanced toolbox under the CAP
- Establishing an On-Farm Sustainability Compass (benchmarking)
- ✓ Proposing a Water Resilience Strategy
- Evaluation of the Nitrates Directive
- Accelerating access to biopesticides
- Reinforcement of EFSA




Valuing food and fostering fair living and working conditions in vibrant rural areas

# A sector where food is valued and offers a fair living and working condition in rural areas

- Fostering fair living and working conditions in vibrant rural areas
- Reconnecting food with territory, seasonality and traditions
- Attracting more women to the profession
- Ensuring the protection of workers' rights
- Supporting agri-food SMEs

#### Main actions

- Updating the EU Rural Action Plan and Rural Pact
- Holding an annual Food Dialogue with food system's actors
- Reviewing the legal framework on public procurement
- Development of food supply chains
- Launching a study on 'ultra-processed foods'
- Reviewing the EU school scheme
- Promoting further uptake of geographical indications
- Updating the EU animal welfare legislation




# F3 – EU-wide online platform for all farmers across Europe
