

New: Delivering environment and climate benefits: moving from conditions to incentives

- 1. Common environment and climate priority areas
- New farm stewardship system (protective practices + SMRs) to uphold high environmental and animal welfare standards adapted to the national farming context
- 3. Protective practices can be supported financially
- 4. Streamlined support for environmental and climate action (integrating current eco-schemes and AECM) with further flexibility for Member States and farmers, including a new transition payment (lump-sum) of up to 200 000 EUR
- New co- financing approach for agri-environmental actions (>30% by MS), thus expanding financial potential for support of ecosystem services going beyond legal obligations
- 6. 'Green' interventions included in the **CAP** "income support" to be financed from ring-fenced Union allocations of 295.7 billion EUR
- 7. Overall contribution for green budget tracking 35% overall MFF, 43% for the NRP
